- 3. Take a cloth. Wipe the windows. How shiny can you make them? Can you see your reflection?


How many trash bins are in the classroom? Check if they are empty. If not, take out the trash and replace the bags. Don't forget to recycle when possible.

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# 2 Let's clean!



Talk and read Have you ever made a big mess that was hard to clean?

Your class is cleaning the school playground. You find some old, dirty coins. You decide to do an experiment to see what cleans them the best. You ask yourself: "What cleans dirty, old coins the best?" You look for different liquids to clean the coins: water with baking soda, vinegar, washing up liquid and cola. Before you start, you guess which one will work best. Most of your classmates think that water with baking soda will be the best.

You decide to do an experiment. You prepare your materials: four empty jars, four dirty 5c coins and a kitchen timer. You fill each jar with one of the liquids. Then you put one coin in each jar and set the timer. You wait for 15 minutes and see what has happened. Look at the coins and see which one is the cleanest and which one is not. Then compare your results with your previous guesses.

#### Pets to pet

Many families own pets. They are great family members. But when it comes to petting dogs or cats, you must be careful. Use gentle strokes. Move your hand along the pet's fur. But you can also pet from head to tail. Let the pet smell your hand first. Take your hand away when the pet looks frightened or becomes nervous. Walk away when the cat's tail is swishing back and forth really fast. Teach your friends how to play with your pet.

### Keeping your house clean with pets

Pets can sometimes make a mess. Dogs and cats lose fur, which can get on furniture and floors. To keep your house clean, brush your pets often to reduce shedding. Clean their paws when they come inside to avoid dirt and mud. Use a lint roller or vacuum to remove fur from furniture. Make sure your pets have a place to sleep and eat, and clean these places often. By doing these things, you can enjoy having pets and keep your house clean.


